## IMPD Outreach Advocates

- The IMPD Outreach Advocates program is a joint venture between the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department (IMPD) and The Julian Center.
- The program provides crisis support, referral and advocacy services to victims of family violence.
- Due to the working relationship between the IMPD and The Julian Center, the advocates are able to go with the police on domestic violence calls.
- The IMPD Advocates assist victims during his or her time of crisis and offer their knowledge, services and expertise.
- These services are free and confidential.

## Program Statistics

- In 2010 over 1,500 victims were served by the IMPD Outreach Advocates.
- Approximately 7% of the Advocates clients in 2010 were men .
- The IMPD Outreach Advocates help to represent The Julian Center in the community; in 2010, over 10,000 individuals were educated by The Julian Center.

## Services Provided to Clients Include

- Crisis Intervention: Interacting with clients in crisis to restore balance and reduce anxiety and fear
- Hospital Response: Accompanying or meeting clients at the hospital
- Civil Legal Advocacy: Assisting clients with legal issues including preparing paperwork for protective orders
- Victim Advocacy: Helping clients obtain needed resources or services including employment, housing, shelter services, healthcare and victim's compensation
- 911 Emergency Phones: Providing cell phones to clients who have no means of contacting the police in an emergency
- Responding with law enforcement to domestic violence calls
- Following-up on all domestic violence related police reports in the IMPD service districts

## Services Provided to the Community Include

- Community Outreach: Advocates work with various service agencies by providing information and assistance to help them better serve clients who are dealing with family violence issues.
- Public Speaking: Providing information and education about The Julian Center, the IMPD Outreach Advocates Program and other issues related to family violence to community and professional groups

## The Julian Center

- The Julian Center offers emergency, transitional and permanent housing
- A variety of other services are offered by The Julian Center including: counseling, legal services, advocacy and children's programs
