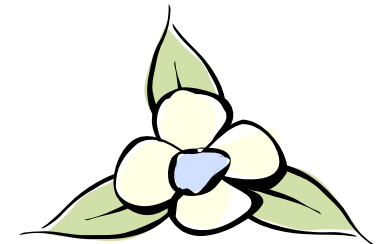

## New Life Transitional Housing Program Mission

The mission of the New Life Transitional Housing Program is to provide safe, affordable housing for a period of up to 24 months to women and children who are homeless due to domestic violence. This housing is provided in the context of a supportive and therapeutic community. The setting offers a structured environment, which provides comprehensive case management and therapeutic services, and educational programs. All services are designed to assist women in gaining understanding of the violence they have experienced in order to heal, and to obtain the awareness and skills necessary to live violence free and self-sufficient lives.
