The newly renovated Julian Center Garden is now open to all who stay at the center as expanded space where they can be safe and begin to rebuild their lives. The garden, located between two historic buildings on Meridian Street in downtown Indianapolis, was designed to be both useful and enjoyable to the families and children who stay at The Julian Center, with shaded seating areas, a toddler play yard, multiple raised vegetable beds, walking paths and beautiful flower beds to enjoy.

In honoring her parents with the dedication of the garden, Robin is reminded of their role modeling of always doing the right thing and helping others who are victims of domestic violence. "I fully support The Julian Center and their mission. I love helping people who help themselves and The Julian Center gives individuals not only a safe place to be, but the tools to rebuild with counseling on finances, job placement and housing. Over 40% of the people at The Julian Center are children, who need a safe place to run around and be a kid. The new garden gives them that with the added fun of learning how to grow fresh vegetables."

In addition to the generosity of the Garden Renovation, Robin and Mark helped to establish the "Friends of the JC Garden" fund for the ongoing maintenance and care of the garden. The fund will allow all those who want to support the garden to donate what they can - whether it be \$5 or \$50.


